Notes from the 11/29/2018 User Group Meeting are below

Improved parking at Porter for horse trailers was accomplished per the request that was brought up at the last user group meeting.

Volunteers met with Littlerock unit foresters to identify and discuss leave tree strategies for trail mix and thunderstruck timber sales. Certain areas that were originally identified will not be harvested as soon as was planned. Unit 3 of the Trailmix timber sale was eliminated and replaced by a sale off army tie road.

Timber Sales:

Army Road tie timber sale will impact the army road tie trail (road). Old road that turned into the trail will now be turned back into a road. Phil proposed that we gate both ends of the road and allow for moto and quad use only around the gate. Joe H. brought up that side by sides currently use this “trail” and that there will be an uproar if we gate it and deny access.

Trailmix impacting WBE, Mt Molly Single track was reviewed again.

Voyager timber sale impacting trails was also reviewed.

Pop Tart – Level Up & Green Line connector. C-6000 road work is in preparation for timber sale.
